Winery Details	Established in 1930 by Joseph Godmé, grandfather of Hugues, in Verzenay. He began bottling after the end of WWII, a rarity for the time. Currently owns a total of 7.6 hectares made up of 80 small plots in Verzenay, Villers-Marmery, Beaumont sur Vesle, Verzy and Villedommange. Certified biodynamic.
Varietal(s)	65% Pinot Noir, 35% Chardonnay
Terroir	Belemnite and micraster chalk
Winemaking	Press is horizontal membrane and gravity used in transferring juices; parcels fermented in small enameled tanks separately; malolactic allowed to occur naturally; 40% aged in neutral oak; no filtration, no fining; disgorged January 2019
Alcohol	12% ABV
Sugars	2 grams/liter
Tasting Notes	Stone fruit, delicate berries and graphite with a pronounced minerality on the finish
